Last year the shelter found loving forever homes for dogs, cats and other small animals, giving them a second chance at happiness.

SERVICES

The Oakville & Milton Humane Society (OMHS) provides services that extend well beyond animal adoptions. We reunite lost pets with their owners, and take in pets that have been abandoned or surrendered. We investigate reports of animal cruelty and participate in legal proceedings when necessary. We provide lifesaving medical and dental services to the animals in our care. And we provide a wildlife rehabilitation liaison function for non-domesticated animals in an effort to return them to their natural environment. The OMHS is there 24/7 for animals in distress and has one of the highest return-to-owner rates in Canada.

- 64% of all stay animals were reunited with their owners
- Investigated 302 new reports of animal cruelty a 26% increase over last year
- 1,278 domestic animals were admitted to the shelter (excludes wildlife)
- 300 animals were surrendered to the shelter
- 357 animals were spayed or neutered



EDUCATE

The OMHS offers a broad range of programs to engage animal lovers of all ages including day camps, clubs, and dog training. We educate the youth in our community about responsible pet ownership and how to engage with animals in a kind and respectful way.

A MILESTONE YEAR FOR THE OMHS

For the Oakville & Milton Humane Society (OMHS) 2018 was a milestone year filled with exciting changes and progress. With the support of our donors, volunteers and staff we are making important strides in advancing animal welfare and leading the

movement to create a more humane world.

We are proud that the OMHS continues to have one of the best rates in Canada for animals being reunited with their families and helping over 559 animals find their forever homes in 2018. We've also undertaken several changes within the shelter itself to make it more customer friendly and functional as we plan for a new facility in the future.

In the past year we have carried out extensive community engagement and

market research in order to better understand how we can further improve the work we do and the services we provide. In addition, the OMHS has created a new mission statement that "We are dedicated to protecting and making life better for animals and connecting the communities that care about them in Oakville and Milton."

Our 2019-2022 Strategic Plan is built on four pillars: Quality of Care, Financial Stability, Community Engagement and Suitable Facilities. Our priority is to deliver high-quality care for our animals and provide the needed resources for our volunteers and

staff to make that happen.

We have also identified our core organizational values which include being compassionate, progressive, engaged with the community and a trusted partner. By giving voice to those that can't speak for themselves, the OMHS will continue to raise awareness to the challenges our animals face and deliver programs and services that help inform the community why their support for animal welfare is so critical.

Many thanks to the Board of Directors

for their leadership and passion over the past year and to our dedicated donors, tireless volunteers and caring staff for helping make 2018 a great success for the OMHS. We look forward to building on our successes in 2019 as we strive to help even more animals that need us.




