Youth Apprenticeship Program

GENERAL INFORMATION:

Our Youth Apprenticeship Program (Y.A.P.) offers 13-16 year olds the chance to learn about animal behaviour, care and safe handling practices in a shelter setting. Participants will have the opportunity to Many of the animals at OMHS are under a great deal of stress - in volunteer directly with the animals in this 10-week program.

Y.A.P. participants can put hours towards community service and resume building.

THE SELECTION PROCESS:

Y.A.P. runs three times per year, with 10 youth in each session. The 30 spots will be filled by lottery. On the day after Labour Day, we will take names and contact information from 9:00 am until midnight. All names will go into a draw, and 30 names will be randomly selected to participate in the following year's program.

Due to the volume of names entered, only those selected to be in the program will be contacted - the successful applicants will be contacted by the end of the week.

HOW IT WORKS:

Once selected, we will meet as a group for an orientation. This will take about two hours and will include a behind-the-scenes tour of the shelter. Then you will sign up for 13 visits to complete over the course of 10 weeks. A visit is a 1.5 - 2 hour block of time in a specific area. These include:

- Cat socializing (9 visits)
- Dog training (| visit)
- Small animal socializing (2 visits)
- Customer care (1 visit)
- Education optional
- Special events optional



We will meet up again, as a group, at the very end of your volunteer time to wrap up.

COST:

Once accepted into the program, the fee is \$385. This covers the cost of materials, and training but is also to provide staff supervision. order to ensure your safety, a staff member must be present while you are volunteering at the shelter.



HOURS & LOCATION:

Following the orientation, you will choose a day and time for cat socializing, which will be the same for 9 weeks (e.g. Monday evenings from 6:45 - 8:15 pm). You will also sign up for other opportunities at this time. The 10th week is to make up any missed nights.

The program is held at the Oakville & Milton Humane Society. The address is 445 Cornwall Road in Oakville.

ANIMAL INTERACTION:

This experience is designed to give you an overview of the shelter and learn about the animals in our care. Our largest, most accessible population of animals is **cats**, so this program has more opportunity to volunteer with the cats. You will have the option of working with dogs for 1 week and small animals for 2 weeks as well.

Customer care and special events all involve

working with people. In the shelter world, it's not just about the animals - it has to also be about the people. It is people that the animals go home to, and it is people, like you, who make our shelter a great place for the animals to stay until their forever homes come along.
